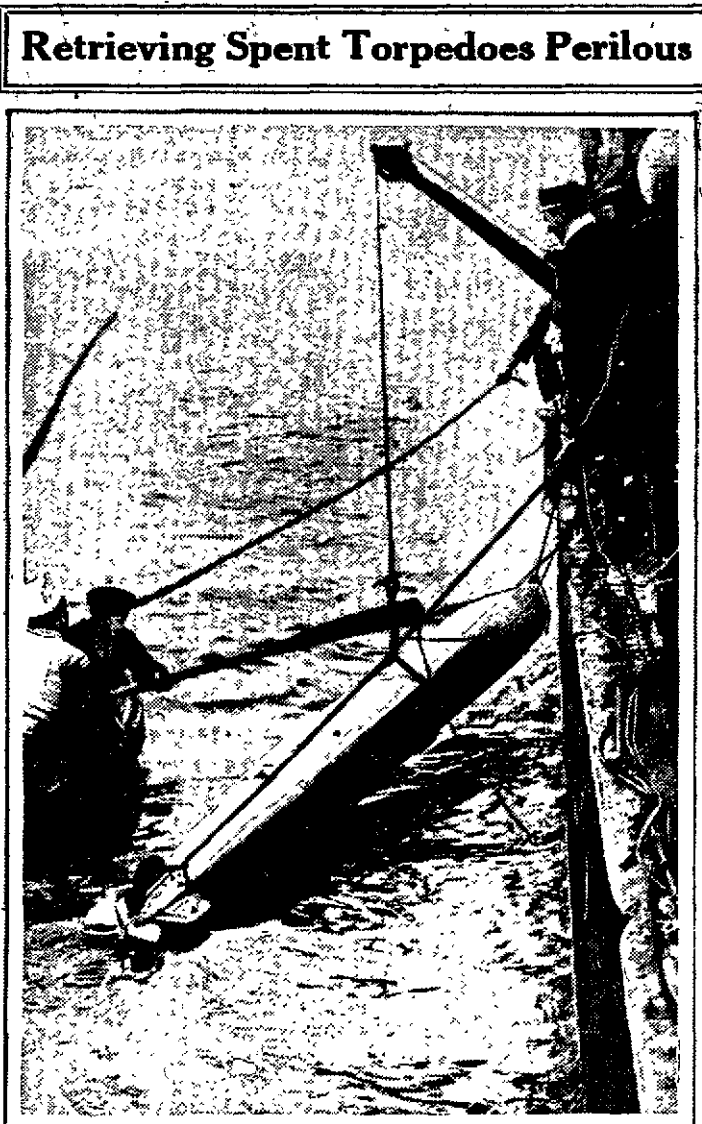

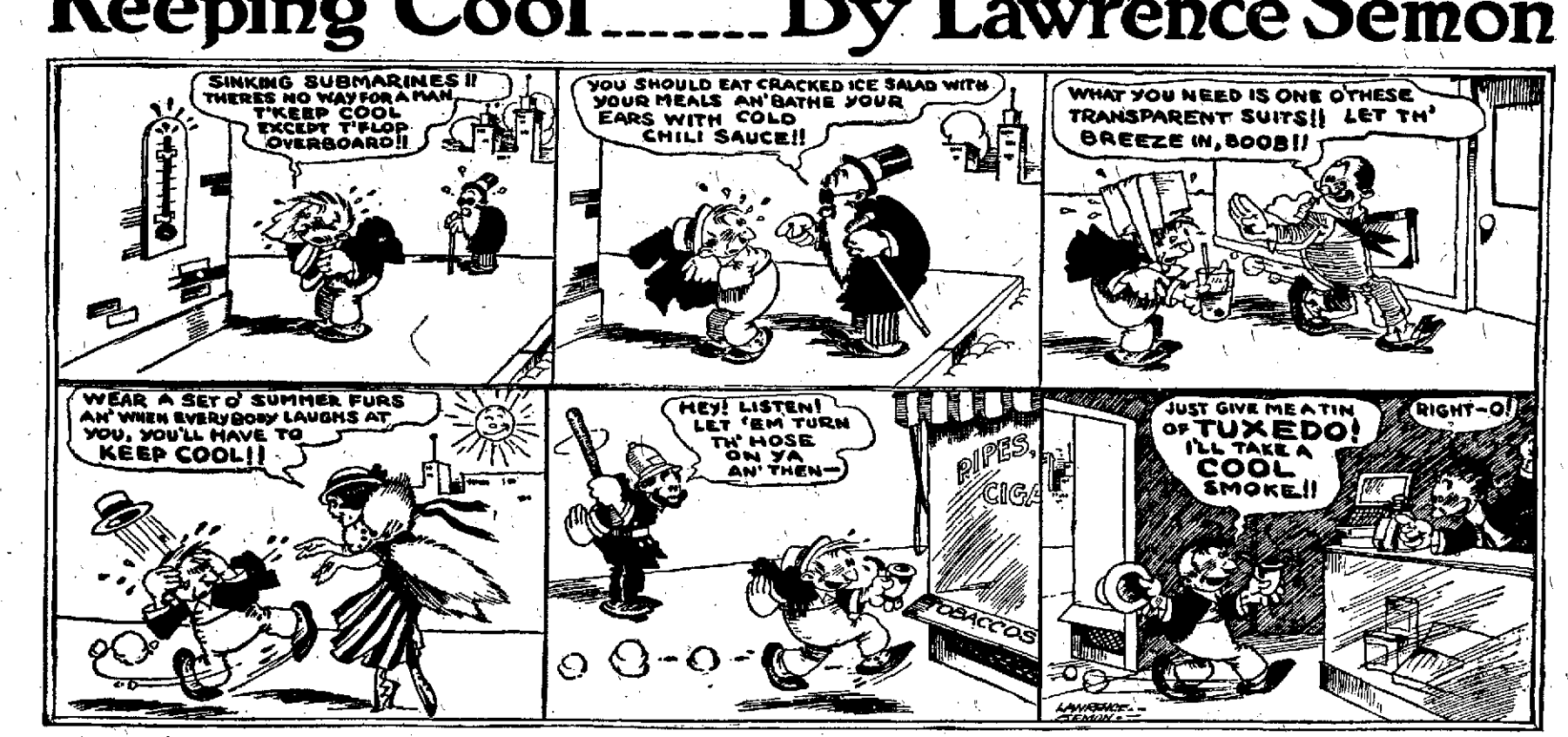

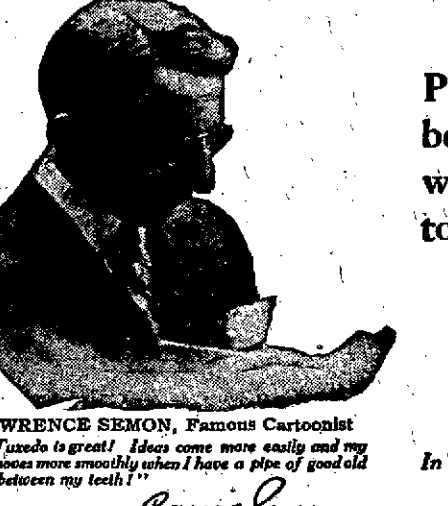

Eight Patients Have Voluntarily Placed Themselves Under Care of City. That the unfortunate victims of the drug habit in Atlanta are not only willing but eager to take advantage of the offer of the city to cure them was shown Monday morning when a young man who formerly held a position in the city voluntarily went to the smaller hospital of the city, where the treatment will be given, and offered to carry out the instructions of the physicians in charge.

Before noon four patients had been admitted and many more were accepting during the afternoon. They will be kept there for three or four weeks, since that period is required in which to cure them.

The hospital and camp used for the patients is on a tract of land owned by the city, bounded by the end of Woodward avenue, near the city stockade. It was formerly used for a small hospital in 1880, and is now completely renovated and is now considered one of the most healthy localities in the city.

418 DISPUTES DECIDED ABOUT COTTON FUTURES

Washington, August 30.—What has been the settlement of the new cotton futures law is typified in the "Program of Work" of the department of agriculture, which is the result of 418 disputes as to grade, quality, staple, length of cotton, involving 39,956 bales, or nearly 100,000,000 pounds, and decided up to June. Disputes pending total 105.

The department has sent 354 sets of official standards to cotton exchanges and dealers in the United States, and to Great Britain, Holland, Canada, and India. Bona fide spot markets designated up to July 1, 1915, are Savannah, Tallahassee, Jacksonville, Little Rock, Memphis, Montgomery, Mobile, Norfolk, Charleston, New Orleans and Boston.

New York, August 30.—While about in line with recent bullish predictions the government crop report, making the condition 69.2 per cent, was followed by a very sharp break in the cotton market here today with December contracts selling off from 10.30, the high point of the morning, to 9.10, a net loss of 10 to 12 points.

There was a renewal of last week's buying movement at the start and after opening at a decline of 8 points to an early high of 9.10, the market fell 11 to 12 points above Saturday's closing figures. The publication of these private conditions, including the reports of last week, apparently stimulated the demand for cotton, but the market here today was chiefly a matter of profit taking.

COTTON 69.2 PER CENT NORMAL, SAYS BUREAU

Indicates 4,317,695 Bales Less Crop Than Last Season.

Washington, August 30.—Drought followed by excessive rains in the cotton belt during August caused deterioration slightly more than the August 25 report indicated. The department of agriculture today announced that the 69.2 per cent below the July condition.

The condition of the crop, as estimated today, as compared with 75.3 per cent a month ago, indicates a decrease of 6.1 per cent. The actual output for the 1914 season as shown by the census figures, was 16,124,595 bales last season.
