BRED DISSATISFACTION. "He has bred dissatisfaction and distrust and discord among the people," says Mr. Chambers, who declares "his present administration, like all his previous administrations, will go on record for obstruction, but for obstruction, not for achievement, for for failure, not for progress, but for stagnation; not for good feeling, but for ill feeling; not as an era when the people were helped, but an era when they were hindered and held back."

WOODWARD'S STATEMENT. Calling on the people to determine between the veracity of Aldine Chambers and his statement on Wednesday issued a statement in answer to a statement by Mr. Chambers appearing in an afternoon newspaper, in which the mayor was charged with perpetrating a lie.

CHAMBERS' STATEMENT. Aldine Chambers' statement follows: "I have not and never did consent for my name to be used in any controversy with a man of his caliber. The people know him well and his statement on Wednesday in 1913. They can also determine for themselves the veracity of Chambers and myself."

WOODWARD'S STATEMENT. "I have never made any such statement to Mr. Walter McElwain as the mayor has alleged. Mr. McElwain, on Wednesday morning, February 11, 1915, knew of the utter and absolute falsity of his statement and he has never since that time been able to carry any such message to the city council. The statement relative to Mr. McElwain and West Mitchell street is equally false."

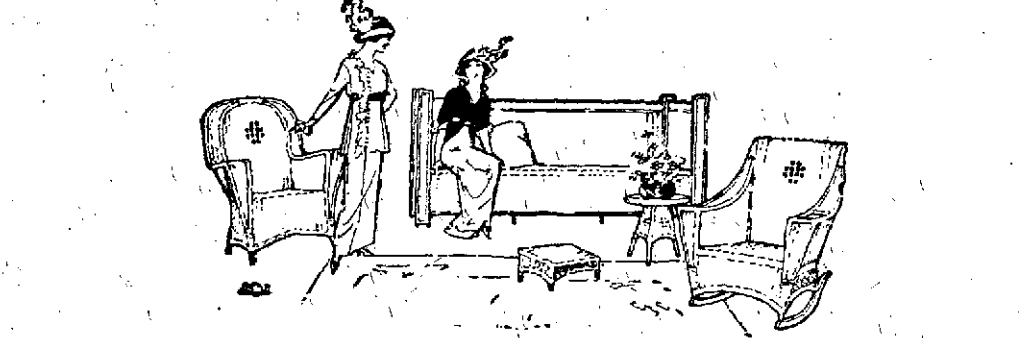

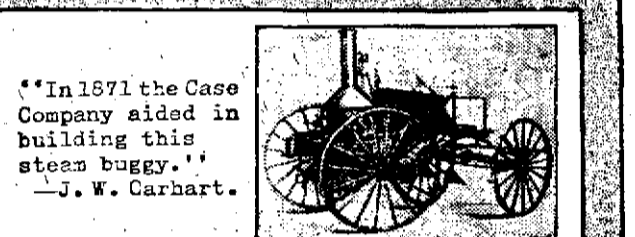

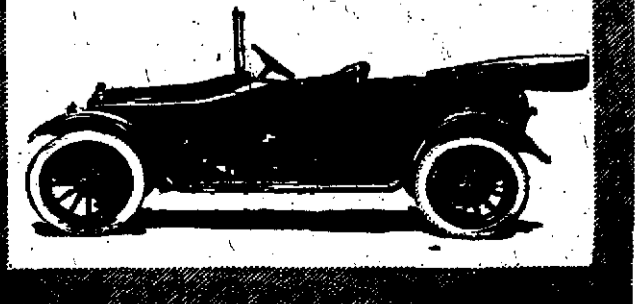
