

BOND COMMISSION PLAN IS PROPOSED BY CHARLES SMITH

Councilman Believes This Would Be Acceptable to People and That Issue for City Improvements Would Carry. WILL PREPARE REPORT AT TODAY'S MEETING \$375,000 for Grady Hospital, and New Schools and Repairs on Others to Be Recommended.

Sensing the hostility of many voters toward a bond issue under the present administration Councilman Charles W. Smith has worked out a plan for creating a bond commission of fifteen members which he says will solve the problem and prove satisfactory to every interest in the city.

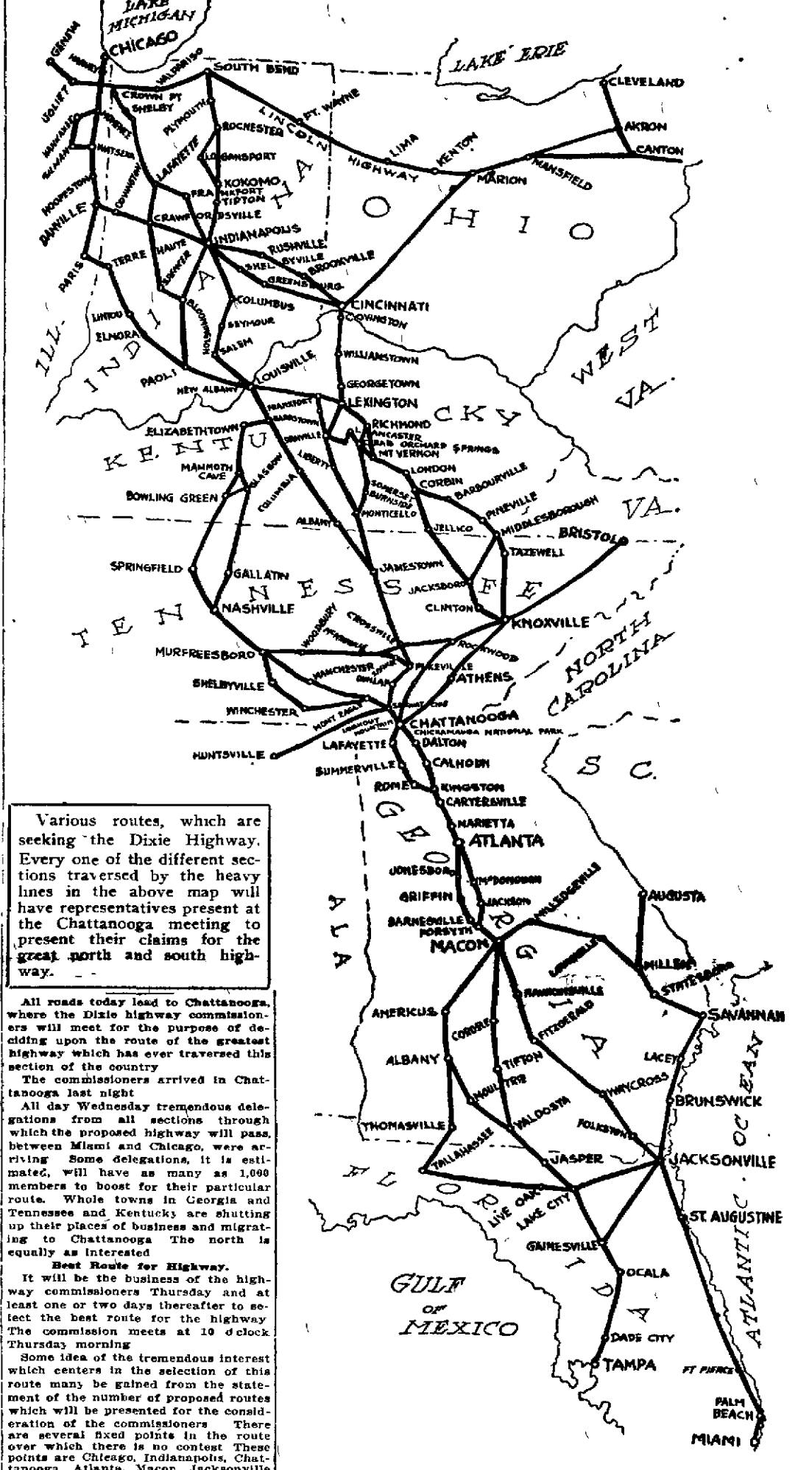
The mayor and members of council are agreed that the necessary funds for school and hospital improvements cannot be taken from the city's normal revenue and that the only resource is through a bond issue. Some members of council have openly opposed a bond issue under the present administration and the general sentiment is against them if they are to be expended by general council.

At a special meeting this afternoon of the bond committee of council, of which Alderman Albert Thomson is chairman, the report of the school probe committee and the special hospital committee will be considered, with a view to reporting to general council at a special session Monday. It is proposed to ask council to call a bond election.

Councilman Smith stated Wednesday that he understood the opposition to bonds and believed that he had evolved a plan that would be acceptable and would mean that the bonds would be carried.

He proposed to create a bond commission of fifteen members, three to be chosen from general council members, three by the three local newspapers from their own ranks, two from the Atlanta Federation of Trades and others from the clearing house, the chamber of commerce, the Retail Merchants' association and other similar business bodies.

NO BARGAINING WITH GERMANY BY UNITED STATES

President Wilson Will Not Allow Issue to Be Complicated by Complaints About Britain's Detention of Cargoes. LIVES ARE ENDANGERED BY GERMANY'S CONDUCT While Only Questions of Property Are Involved by British Action—American-German Controversy Necessitates Prompt Understanding.

Washington, May 19.—President Wilson will await a reply from Germany to the recent American note before making further representations to the allies on alleged violations of international law in their commercial embargo on Germany.

This was made clear today with the explanation that data concerning detentions of American cargoes had not been completed, and that, moreover, the notes under preparation would not be sent now in any event because President Wilson was unwilling to have the situation with Germany complicated by the American government's correspondence with Great Britain.

It is understood the president's position is that the case of the United States as set forth in its note to Germany should be disposed of irrespective of any contemplated move with regard to the allies. The idea prevailing in some quarters that representations to the allies might influence the character of the German reply is not shared, it is said, by the president, who is understood to hold that the German government naturally should have confidence that the United States would do its utmost to safeguard its rights in all cases.

The controversy between the United States and Germany, it was pointed out, involves the safety of the lives of American citizens at sea and necessitates a prompt understanding. Questions of property raised by the issues over contraband as between the United States and Great Britain require more time to collect data and no lives are endangered by delay.

Secretary Bryan said today that "no immediate answer" was expected from Germany to the recent American note. The German government is occupied just now with the Austro-Italian crisis, and a best reply will require several days of preparation.

TEUTONS DRIVING AT CZAR'S FORCES ON 200-MILE LINE

Austro-Germans, Continue Massed Attacks on Russians, Who Are Trying to Reform Behind the River San. SAN HAS BEEN CROSSED BY THE TEUTONIC ALLIES According to Berlin and Vienna—In Bukowina the Russians Are Reported to Have Broken the Austrian Extreme Right.

London, May 19.—The Austrian and German armies continue massed attacks against the Russians, who are attempting to form a new line behind the river San, both north and south of Przemysl and west of the Vistula river, in southern Poland.

These attacks, according to Austrian and German reports, have met with their greatest success north of Przemysl, where the Germanic allies have crossed the river and have occupied Sienawa, on the eastern bank they also claim to have captured positions southeast of the former Austrian fortress, while their heavy guns are keeping up a bombardment from the west.

In southern Poland their progress is not so marked, the Russians having had strong forces concentrated at Lvangorod, which they brought into the field and checked the advance.

It is stated from Petrograd that the Germans and Austrians are now between thirty and forty army corps on the 200-mile front from Opatow, in Poland, to Kolozi in eastern Galicia.

Italian Chief of Staff and His Aides Already on the Austrian Frontier—All the Railroads Taken Over by the Government for Military Purposes—United States Asked to Care for Italy's Interest in Austria. Austrian and German Ambassadors Ready to Leave Rome.

London, May 19.—While Italy is confidently believed to be making final preparations to enter the war on the side of the allies, Austria, who would be the direct object of her attack, is with her German ally, attempting to inflict such a defeat on Russia that she will be able to divert troops if necessary, to meet her new foe in the south.

Dispatches from Rome continue somewhat contradictory, but most of them agree that Italy has decided on the side of war, that the German and Austrian ambassadors are preparing to leave Rome, and that the consuls general of those two countries either already have left their posts or will do so.

On the other hand, a message coming through Paris says that Austria has submitted new proposals which she hopes will induce Italy to remain neutral. A definite answer is expected from the Italian foreign office before the chamber of deputies meets tomorrow.

Meantime Italy is completing preparations for war. Lieutenant General Count Codorno, Italian chief-of-staff, has arrived with his staff at Vienna, near the frontier.

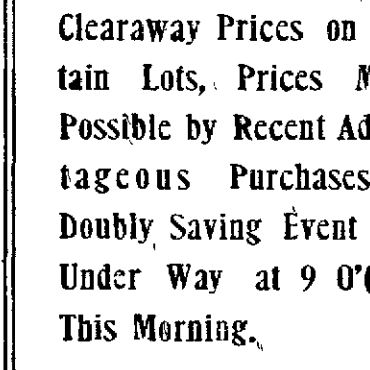

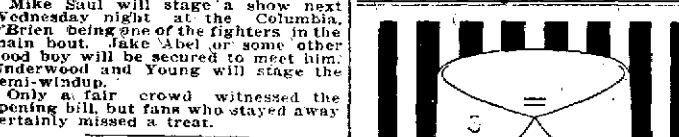
