PLOT TO OVERTHROW VENEZUELA RULERS WHIPPED BY THE BUD

Assassination of President
Juan Vicente Gomez Was
Frustrated by Arrest of Gen.
Delir Chalbaud

MANY PROMINENT MEN
FLED FROM COUNTRY

President's Assassination Was
Planned to Take Place at the
Inauguration of the Vene-
zuelan Automobile Club

(By Associated Press.)
WILLEMSTADT, Curaçao, June 13.—Details of the recent political disturbance in Venezuela, where a large number of prominent men were imprisoned or took to flight following accusations of conspiracy against the government, reached here today.

It is stated that a plot to assassinate President Juan Vicente Gomez was frustrated by the imprisonment of General Delir Chalbaud and a number of his friends. The plot was to have been carried out at the inauguration of the Venezuelan Automobile club a few weeks ago.

An announcement of the government says the plot was uncovered through Manuel Torres, who had been recruited to join in the conspiracy. When Torres became a party to the plot he fled toward Miraflores palace to avoid the president's wrath. He was captured by the police and taken to the president's residence. He was then taken to the imprisonment of the president.

MOTORCYCLIST HITS A NEGRO; BOTH INJURED

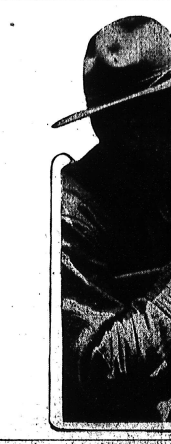

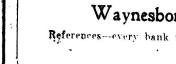

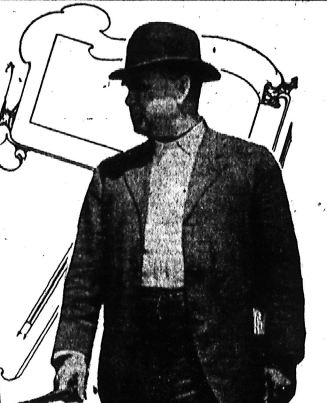
