HARDMAN DECLARES HE EXPECTS TO WIN
Says No Candidate Has Enough Votes to Make Result a Certainty

Hon. R. N. Hardman, who is in the race for speaker of the house of representatives during the forthcoming session of the general assembly, and who will be opposed by Hon. W. J. Burnett, of Hancock county, and Hon. J. E. Sheppard, of Sumter, gave out the following statement Saturday afternoon with reference to his candidacy:

"To date I have made no public statement with reference to the campaign for the speakership of the house of representatives. I wish frankly and candidly to state that I have no intention of making a quiet campaign among my friends. I have merely written letters to the members of the house only, and I have not even met with any of them from every member-elect and, unlike other candidates, I will present myself openly to state that I haven't a sufficient number of pledges to insure my election. At the same time, from an absolute knowledge of the situation, I wish to state that no candidate for speaker has a sufficient number of unqualified pledges to elect. In fact, I doubt if the straight pledges of all three of the candidates combined are sufficient to elect any one."

"I have written statements from nearly a majority of the members of the house to the effect that they are not pledged and that they are not pledged until they reach the capital and look over the situation. I do not count as my supporters those members who have expressed their opinion to me. I would like to see you speak, or I see, no reason why you should not be speaker, and if I think you would make a good speaker, and if I see no reason why I should not support you, this number would make me quite sure of my support as those candidates who I have mentioned. I have written to my friends, the gentlemen from Hancock and both of us having the large number would increase the membership of the house in three per cent. I think the membership of the senate has been increased by the same per cent. I am a candidate for president of the senate, and in which event the majority of the members of the senate would not be composed of the representatives of the people, but of all the people themselves."

"I make this further frank and sincere statement to the public and to the members-elect."

"I was greatly very much impressed by the numerous repeated and extravagant claims made for one of the other candidates, for the speakership, and I came to Atlanta on Wednesday last with the avowed intention of seeing the situation and if the facts upon investigation, justified the claims made by my distinguished friend, who opposes me, and I really believe, that I would find them true. I intended to withdraw from this race in justice to my friends, who have been so generous and kind to their support. But I will state, just as frankly and as sincerely, that after carefully looking over the entire situation, I am convinced that I will not be elected until I can be elected by the members of the house. I have further investigated, the more thoroughly convinced that my chances are equal to those of any other gentleman in the race. The only difference between us is this: My friend from Hancock has been polling and counting his votes through the press of Georgia for the past six months, and will be polled and counted on the 21st in the house of representatives. And that is the time and the place where the votes will count."

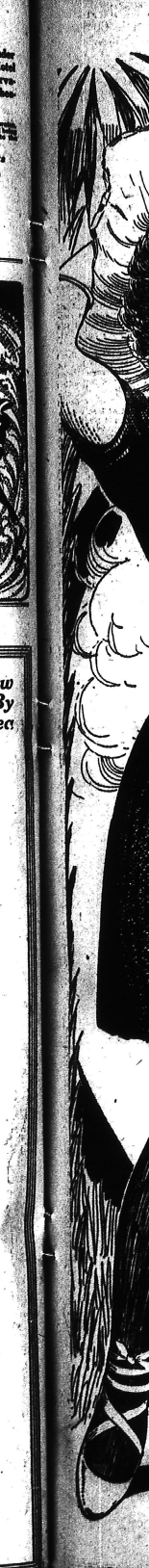
